Latest Executive Orders Related to COVID-19

STATE FAIRS ORDER #42

Cancels the State Fairs in Springfield and DuQuoin scheduled for 2020, to protect the health and safety of fairgoers, entertainers, competitors, vendors, employees, and those living in the surrounding areas.

LIMITED REOPENING OF SCHOOLS ORDER #40

All public and nonpublic schools in Illinois serving pre-kindergarten through 12th grade students may open for limited in-person educational purposes, such as summer school, after the regular 2019-2020 school term. Schools must follow IDPH guidance and all schools may continue to provide food and other non-educational services.

Unemployment Insurance and COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on the United States economy, leading to an unprecedented number of unemployment claims. Through the five weeks from March 1 to April 4, Illinois received 513,173 initial unemployment claims. That is greater than the total number of initial claims for the entirety of 2019 (489,831) and five times greater than the claims filed in the first five weeks of the 2008 great recession.

All requests by mail must be received by the Election Authority by 10/29/2020.

All in-person early voting requests must be made by 11/2/2020.

Zoom Instructions

Join by computer

Close any program on your computer that uses your camera, for instance Skype. Click the Zoom link that's been sent to you in an email, and Zoom should automatically and quickly download to your computer. In Downloads on your computer, click Zoom_launcher.exe. Zoom should direct you to this with a large orange flag. Once Zoom has launched, a screen should pop up asking for your name. This will identify you during the meeting. You should now be part of the meeting. Click the green button that says "Join Audio By Computer". Tip: Have a headset available if possible to minimize feedback –cellphone earbuds will work well.

Join by tablet or smartphone

If you choose to use your tablet or smartphone, be sure to download the Zoom app ahead of time. For Android users, go to the Goggle Play store by clicking on this: For Apple users, Go to the Apple store by clicking on this: Search for the Zoom app: and click "install" Once you have downloaded the Zoom app, Click the Zoom link that's been sent to you in an email Once Zoom has launched, a screen should pop up asking for your name. This will identify you during the meeting. You should now be part of the meeting.

Join by telephone

First, dial the phone number provided in the Zoom email. When prompted, dial the meeting ID number that is also provided. Your phone will be automatically muted once the meeting starts. If you want to speak, press *6 to unmute.

In consideration of the whole group, please arrive 10 minutes early in order to get successfully connected. Someone will be on hand to help you if needed. This is especially important if this is your first time using Zoom.

Assessor's Office

Automatic Renewal of Exemptions

In response to the Covid-19 crisis, the State has enacted legislation to automatically renew exemptions for tax year 2020. The automatic renewals will affect the following exemptions: Senior Citizen Assessment Freeze, Homestead Exemption for Disabled Persons, and Standard Homestead Exemption for Disabled Veterans.

If a taxpayer had any of the exemptions in place for tax year 2019, then the exemption will automatically be granted for tax year 2020. Taxpayers do not need to renew or file for this year. If a taxpayer has already submitted an application or renewal for 2020, no further action is required.

The only instance where an application must be made is for first time applicants or if there has been a change in the Disabled Veterans disability rating.

This legislation was supported by the Lake County Township Assessor's Association to protect the most vulnerable population from the spread of Covid-19. Lake County will be mailing notices to those taxpayers who are impacted.
