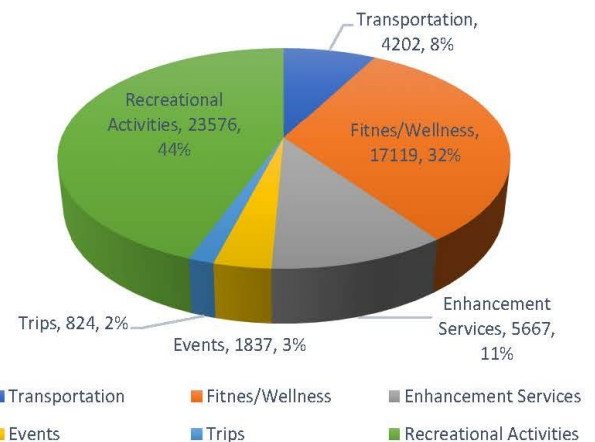

Congratulations to the Park Place for a job well-done. This chart illustrates the number of seniors who received services from the Park Place Center. Our buses transported seniors safely to and from medical appointments, grocery shopping, area stores, from senior buildings, to nursing homes to visit loved ones, and shuttles to and from Park Place for events, regular programs and important socialization. Supervisor Jones has conducted meetings since the beginning of last year to develop a plan to address special transportation needs. The collaboration with Pace and Shields Township resulted in the creation of a **Community Disability transportation program**. ### Key Steps to Minimize Risk After Equifax Data Breach Determining Whether You Have Been Affected:

It is likely that anyone with a credit history is one of the 143 million Americans whose personal information was exposed in a data breach at Equifax, one of the three major credit reporting agencies. Hackers accessed people's names, Social Security numbers, birth dates, addresses, and in some instances, driver's license numbers.

While it is safest to assume that you were affected, to verify this go to the Equifax site, [www.equifaxsecurity2017.com](http://www.equifaxsecurity2017.com). The site mentions enrolling in "TrustedID Premier"—you do not have to enroll. TrustedID Premier is a credit monitoring service that is only initially free and that does NOT fully protect consumers.

**Risks from the Data Breach:** Perhaps the greatest risk is that an identity thief will open credit accounts in your name. While you are ultimately not liable for the charges, resolution of these situations is never pleasant, can damage your credit and it may take significant effort to clean up. The best way to prevent new account identity theft is a credit freeze.

Another risk is that unauthorized persons might gain access to your existing accounts. You should pay careful attention to all of your accounts by frequently reviewing statements and noticing if monthly statements do not arrive.

An additional risk is that an identity thief files a tax return your name, seeking a large refund, and directing that refund to a prepaid card. Filing legitimate tax returns as soon as possible may prevent a scam filing later.

**A Credit Freeze Is Recommended:** The strongest measure you can take to prevent an identity thief from opening a credit account in your name is to request a credit freeze. Creditors that rely on a credit report/ score in granting credit are likely to refuse to offer credit if they cannot obtain a report/score. To obtain a credit freeze, you need to contact each of the three reporting agencies below. Setting up a freeze and lifting it in the future costs from \$5 to \$10 for each reporting agency. It is very important to keep the password or PIN assigned when you obtain a credit freeze, as you will need it to lift the freeze temporarily or permanently when applying for new credit, a new job, an apartment rental or new insurance. A freeze can last forever (seven years in a few states), which may be a good thing as there is no time limit for an identity thief using your personal information.

**Coming January 2018!**

Over 15 million people under age 55 with disabilities have difficulty getting the transportation they need. Supervisor Jones has conducted meetings to develop a plan to address these transportation needs. The collaboration resulted in the expansion of the transportation program called Dial A Ride. This program will provide a vital lifeline for people who are Seniors (60+) and disabled residents (16+) to access employment, education, healthcare, and community life. The collaboration included; Waukegan Township, Shield Township, and Pace Paratransit.

## Keeping You Informed:

### Seniors Fraud Prevention Act

Although most anyone can be a target of fraud and identity theft, senior identity theft is on the rise and those ages 50+ are often in the cross-hairs of scammers.

The U.S. government is taking steps to help circumvent the high level of fraud aimed at seniors, but it can only do so much — and progress in this area has been fairly slow. Many are hoping for something on the federal level.

A bill aptly named the **Seniors Fraud Prevention Act** has been introduced in Congress twice now, once in 2013 and again in 2015. The bill aims to establish an advisory office within the Federal Trade Commission's Bureau of Consumer Protection that works to help prevent fraud that targets seniors. The advisory office would do so through monitoring of the market for mail, television, Internet and telemarketing fraud that specifically targets seniors and informing both seniors and their caregivers of any possible threats. A website would also be created with tips and resources. Unfortunately, the bill hasn't gained much traction and is currently projected as having a 1% chance of being enacted.

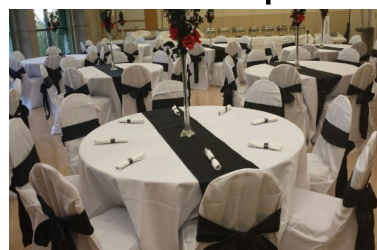
